

Third Sunday of Lent

Mission Statement

We, the people of St. Bavo Parish are committed to be the living presence of Christ in the world today.

Empowered by the Spirit, we strive to live our shared commitment through liturgical celebrations, prayer, education, spiritual growth, bearing witness to faith and service to all.



In the weekday readings for this Third Week of Lent, Jesus faces some serious opposition, for a variety of reasons. His hometown crowd in Nazareth is amazed at his teaching, but still skeptical. They demand a sign to prove that Jesus is more than just a local boy who has developed delusions of grandeur. But Jesus refuses to

humor them. In fact, he strongly suggests that their envy, prompted by a genuine prophet arising from among them, is the reason why they will not see the same miracles that Jesus has performed elsewhere. This criticism stings them so harshly that they try to seize Jesus and kill him.

In another instance, some people in a crowd accuse Jesus of being in league with Satan, because of his ability to cast out demons. In defending himself against this false charge, Jesus teaches an important lesson about what these exorcisms actually signify. If a power great enough to overcome Satan's minions has come into the world, "then the Kingdom of God has come upon you." All of Jesus' exorcisms and healings serve as signs of the great Paschal Mystery to be revealed soon.

On Wednesday, Jesus answers a different false charge that many of the religious leaders have leveled against him, namely, that he seems intent on abolishing the Law of Moses. Jesus rejects that claim and explains that he has come not to abolish, but to fulfill the Law. Of course, his detractors would cite as evidence to the contrary many instances in which Jesus challenged Sabbath restrictions and purification laws. However, those were not God's laws, but only rabbinical teachings which sought to interpret and implement God's commandments. Jesus insists that God's commandments must be followed to the letter. Anyone who breaks them, or teaches others to do so, will be punished. But those who obey and teach God's commandments faithfully "will be called greatest in the Kingdom of heaven."

The gospel on Friday shows what Jesus means by "fulfilling the Law." Ironically, the one who expresses the profound insight is not Jesus, but a scribe. This is a rare instance in which a scholar of the Law approaches Jesus with respect and openness, treating him like an esteemed rabbi, not a contemptible adversary. The scribe asks Jesus to identify the most important of all the commandments. Jesus quotes the famous "Shema," which commands all in Israel to worship God alone and to love God with their whole heart, soul, mind and strength. But then he adds a second commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The scribe immediately apprehends the deep connection between these two commandments, commending Jesus for naming them together as the keys to understanding the whole Law. He remarks that fulfilling these commandments "is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." That same sentiment, which Jesus affirms, is also heard in Saturday's reading from the Prophet Isaiah: "For it is love that I desire, not sacrifice, and knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings."


Every Tuesday • 4 PM and 7 PM
