



Mass Intentions



This week the daily readings feature St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians. The churches in Galatia were among the first Christian communities that Paul established. He visited them multiple times, since they were not far from Antioch of Syria, the starting point for all of his missionary journeys. Unfortunately for Paul, they were also not far from Israel and the influence of Jewish Christians who opposed some aspects of Paul's teaching. After Paul, in

conjunction with the Apostles in Jerusalem, assured the Gentiles in Galatia that they could be full-fledged Christians without adopting any Jewish customs or religious practices, others who followed after him insisted on just the opposite. They taught that Gentile Christians must accept the Law of Moses in its entirety. That meant accepting not only the core moral teachings, which are also central to Christianity, but also customs such as circumcision and dietary restrictions, which have no bearing on one's Christian faith. Paul's anger boils over, as he calls the Galatians "stupid" and "bewitched." He's incensed that they would grant more authority to these false teachers than to him, their spiritual father, who first introduced them to Christ and his way.

Paul goes a bit overboard as he defends his right to proclaim the Gospel and define the boundaries of authentic Christian practice. We might think that Paul is at a disadvantage, because he's not one of Jesus' hand-picked Apostles. But Paul argues otherwise. The *Risen Lord* picked him, by confronting him as he persecuted the Church, converting him from his misguided ways, and sending him out on mission to spread the faith. Paul even claims that he learned the Gospel by *direct revelation from Jesus*, not by instruction from any of the Apostles. When he describes the so-called "Council of Jerusalem," when he and Barnabas traveled to Jerusalem to discuss with the Apostles their successful outreach to the Gentiles, Paul makes it sound as though he lectured the Apostles and they simply affirmed everything that he said. The Acts of the Apostles paints a very different picture of that same event. It shows Peter and James playing leading roles, with Peter advocating for the Gentiles and James proposing the wording of a compromise resolution. The testimony of Paul and Barnabas merely supports what Peter is saying, rather than determining the outcome of the Council.

Since we trust Paul's understanding of the Gospel, we don't need to concern ourselves with how he came to know the Lord's will for his Church. Instead, we can focus on Paul's core message for the Galatians, which is that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ, not through adherence to the Law of Moses. Paul calls the law "our disciplinarian for Christ." In other words, the law prepared God's people for the Gospel, but has now become unnecessary and obsolete in light of the Gospel. Christians do not need to become "children of Abraham" by adopting Jewish customs, when they can become children of God and of Abraham by following Christ.
